Appliqué Artistry

Textile artist **Wende Cragg** grew up in Berkeley, Calif., surrounded by Craftsman bungalows and a family of fine woodworkers who were influenced by the work of Greene & Greene. Her passion for the Arts and Crafts movement inspired a collection of hand-crafted wall panels and pillows using one of the oldest known art forms—appliqué—a technique of sewing or “applying” layered fabric. Her designs, with names such as Roycroft, Oak Park and Arroyo Frieze, are meticulously sewn with silks and linens in nature’s color palette.
